



Girl Scout Overnighter 2010 Badge Workshop Descriptions

GETTING TO KNOW YOU

The Knott's Berry Farm Girl Scout Overnighter brings together girls from all over California and Arizona and gives them the opportunity to make new friends. This workshop, designed to help girls get to know each other, includes making and exchanging friendship bracelets.

LIVING HISTORY: PIONEER WOMEN

Nancy Kelsey was the first of many American women to make the overland pioneer journey to California. Scouts will have a chance to meet this remarkable woman, listen to her enthralling story and learn what a frontier women's life was like in the mid 1800's.

QUILTING

Nancy Kelsey shares her memories through the use of quilt squares. This workshop allows Scouts to begin learning about the folk art of quilting and teaches a little history as well.

TOY MAKER PRESENTATION AND GAMES

Knott's Toy Maker takes us back in time to the pre-electronic era of the 1800's, before video games and virtual experiences, to discover the kinds of dolls, toys and games that our great grandparents loved. Along with this workshop is the opportunity to participate in games and activities and have some good old-fashioned fun!

WEAVING DEMONSTRATION AND WEAVING CRAFT

Weaving is one of the oldest and most enduring crafts, having spanned centuries and crossed many cultures. Knott’s Spinner/Weaver will give the history of and demonstrate different types of weaving. The presentation will include the opportunity to make your own weaving project.
